## Access to Coverage and Care

- Innovation in payment and delivery is evidenced with improved health outcomes and technology enabled care teams.

- All patients benefit from provider-led, value-based care models where care is integrated across the continuum, and the need for acute care decreased.
- Patients and their clinicians make health care decisions, not health insurers.



## Affordability

We envision care coordinated across all settings with providers working together to ensure patients receive all the care they truly need at the right time in the right place. The common good is achieved when:

- Working families have access to Medicaid, or other health insurance programs, that fit in their budgets.
- Patients are empowered with information on healthy lifestyles, out-of-pocket costs, and effectiveness of treatments.

- Patients receive timely care because commercial insurers no longer routinely impose egregious prior authorization red tape and delay payment to providers.

- **Providers are incentivized to collaborate and provide coordinated, seamless care** to all populations, and private equity no longer cherry-picks the most lucrative service lines.
