

Of the 14 lectures provided by the Society of Critical Care Medicine (SCCM) the following have been prioritized prior to redeployment.

Required:

- Recognition and Assessment of the Seriously Ill Patient
- Diagnosis and Management of Acute Respiratory Failure
- Mechanical Ventilation I
- Mechanical Ventilation II
- Monitoring Oxygen Balance and Acid-Base Status
- Diagnosis and Management of Shock
- Management of Life-threatening Electrolyte and Metabolic Disturbances

The remaining lectures will be available to each enrolled provider for 12 months.

IF FCCS Certification is desired, the remaining lectures must complete within 12 months, along with three skills stations.

Remaining lectures:

- Airway Management
- Cardiopulmonary/Cerebral Resuscitation
- Neurologic Support
- Basic Trauma and Burn Support
- Acute Coronary Syndromes
- Life Threatening Infections: Diagnosis and Antimicrobial Therapy Selection
- Special Considerations

Skills stations may be scheduled later depending on level of participation:
