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What's Changed: The Community Resource Directory (CRD) has evolved since its initial launch. The CRD updated link is now available with Single Sign-on for Trinity Health colleagues. This document serves two purposes: 1) raise awareness about the platform and 2) connect colleagues and other individuals in need to social services.

Trinity Health is working with the Aunt Bertha organization to provide the <u>Trinity Health Community Resource Directory</u>, an online portal connecting the people we serve, colleagues and community members in need to health resources and social services within the community and across all Trinity Health locations.

The Trinity Health Community Resource Directory, using the Aunt Bertha tool, allows colleagues to search for free or reduced-cost health resources and social services by zip code, such as

- Food
- Housing
- · Financial assistance
- Medical care
- Transportation
- Utility assistance
- Childcare

Colleagues with Zenworks may access the Community Resource Directory through the community resources icon. Additionally, or for those without Zenworks, colleagues may access the directory at <u>https://trinityhealthstaff.auntbertha.com/</u>.

TogetherCare and MyChart

The Community Resource Directory is embedded directly into TogetherCare, allowing providers to refer patients to critical community resources to address their social needs. Patients may access the Community Resource Directory directly through the MyChart app, allowing them to navigate the site, make self-referrals and track connections.

Non-TogetherCare Facilities

Colleagues at facilities not yet on TogetherCare may screen and refer patients using the <u>Social Needs Screening Form</u>. This tool customizes the patients community resource search to more accurately create referrals, as well as to monitor referrals, and understand when and how those connected have been assisted.
